Teachers' Notes

Translation - *Ducobu*

This combines translation, authenticity and culture - pat on the back. The partial translation provided makes the activity accessible to learners with limited knowledge of French and removes/reduces the need to look words up.

Answers

Ducobu is the hero of a series of very funny comic strips invented/created by two Belgian artists in 1992. Ducobu is a tubby boy who always wears a jumper/pullover with horizontal yellow and black stripes.

Ducobu's adventures often take place in his primary school. He has a huge amount of imagination and he often earns/wins a lot of money with/thanks to his excentric inventions.

However, in class, Ducobu is very lazy and always comes last. He loves to cheat and he always tries to copy Léonie's work (she always gets 10/10). What's more, he constantly exasperates Mr Latouche, his teacher.

When he is punished and sent to the back of the class, Ducobu loves to spend his time with Néness, the skeleton «made in China». Néness is not very conventional, for he often takes part in the scenarios invented by Ducobu to try and cheat.

There are now three films based on the comic strips. The most recent, **Ducobu 3**, was released in February 2020.
